Overview

- NJDOE requires schools to self-assess every year as part of the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR)
- Self-assessment based on 8 core elements and 26 indicators from 7/1/17 to 6/30/18
- Once this data is submitted, the NJDOE reviews the self-assessment
- No minimum score provided by NJDOE for passing or failing
- Baseline score for meeting all requirements is 52 points
- Perfect score is 78 of 78
- Last Year's State-Approved Self Assessment
