# **MINUTES**

- I. The meeting was called to order at 8:08 PM by President Gardner.
- II. The FLAG SALUTE was led by Mr. Ferrante.
- III. The SUNSHINE LAW STATEMENT was read by President Gardner.

- VI. OPEN TO THE PUBLIC FOR AGENDA ITEMS ONLY
- VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT/BOARD PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

- Mr. Mohre shared that Mr. James Butcher, OPS music teacher, was selected "Teacher of the Year" by the Demolay Society, an organization dedicated to preparing young men to lead successful, happy, and productive lives. He added that Mr. Butcher was nominated by one of his former students, current 8<sup>th</sup> grader, Simon Kramer. Mr. Butcher will be honored at a ceremony this coming Sunday.
- Mr. Mohre announced that the OPS Halloween Parade will take place on the lawn of Memorial Field on the afternoon of October 30<sup>th</sup>.
- Mr. Mohre reminded parents to visit the school district's Wednesday Web Watch
  feature weekly. He explained that by logging on to <a href="www.oradellschool.org">www.oradellschool.org</a> and
  clicking on the NOTICES button, parents will find the latest school-home
  communications as well as information resources about H1N1 Influenza.
- Mr. Mohre shared that OPS has begun its implementation of the Learnia Program I grades 3, 4, and 5. He explained that Learnia is an online formative assessment program that uses current student assessment information to aid teachers in planning for both individual, small group, and whole group instruction.
- Mr. Mohre recognized the compassion and benevolence of the OPS faculty in contributing \$500.00 to this year's Avon Walk for the Cure and commended the faculty for teaming with OPS moms in the fight against breast cancer. He also expressed appreciation to OPS teachers Mrs. Boccanfuso and Mrs. Blakeslee for leading the fundraising effort.
- Mr. Mohre delivered a presentation on the Spring 2009 formal student assessment program results.

Mr. Mohre presented testing information relevant to the 2009 NJASK (grades 3, 4, 5, and 6), the Cognitive Abilities Test (grades 2 and 4) and the New Jersey Proficient Assessment of State Standards (grade 2). He provided NJASK comparative data pertaining to New Jersey's District Factor Group I for each of the language arts, mathematics, and science subtests and explained what each subtest entailed in terms of the skills assessed. Information specific to the scores of particular student groups over a period of time was also presented as were general observations and nine recommendations related to the instructional program.

Mr. Gardner asked if we have a breakdown of District Factor Group I just for Bergen County.

Mr. Mohre explained that specific comparative data for Bergen County is typically not available until February or March.

Parents wanted to know what specifically was going to be done for our current 6<sup>th</sup> graders who did not meet the proficiency level on the 5<sup>th</sup> grade language arts and math test.

Mr. Mohre spoke about the diagnostic testing that was completed for students entering the instructional support program and referred to the recommendations outlined in the presentation.

Parents wanted to know when the Learnia program was going to start and if it was going to be utilized with the 6<sup>th</sup> graders

Parents also asked how our District compares to other similar school districts in Bergen County. Parents also felt that the core novel textbooks have been the same for several years and asked if they would be updated soon.

Mr. Mohre shared that testing had begun.
