# School Supplies 2015-2016

### Upper Elementary Instruction at OPS!

For several years at OPS, we had six sections of  $6^{th}$  grade, which allowed us to utilize a twohouse system (placing three teachers in each house with one teaching math, one literacy and one science/social studies). However, this year and for the next several years, we will only have five sections of sixth grade, which impacts the two-house structure. As a result of this change and because of the increased rigor of the academic standards in math and literacy in 5<sup>th</sup> grade, we implemented a new structure for BOTH 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students.

During the 2015-2016 school year (as was the case during the 2014-2015 school year), EVERY 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grader will have TWO teachers, creating five teams of two teachers across 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade. One teacher will teach reading, writing, grammar, vocabulary and other language arts related topics. The other member of the team will teach math, science and social studies, rotating between teaching a social studies unit for several weeks and then switching to a science unit. This approach will allow teachers to spend more time planning and focusing on specific curricular areas. It will also allow students to learn to adapt to different teaching styles. Most importantly, it encourages collaboration as teachers "share" students --- sharing what they notice about strengths, areas to strengthen, successful strategies utilized, etc.
