The past three weeks have been a blur. On the one hand, it feels like we were just handing out packets and laptops on that eventful Friday. On the other hand, it feels like eons since I have seen your children or waved to you at drop-off. Our remote learning journey has been filled with contradictions like that. My child has too much work. My child doesn't have enough work. The one thing that is helping my child is IXL. My child does not learn via IXL. My family needs to disconnect during Spring Break. We should not have a Spring Break.

Well, next week is Spring Break, and teachers have been instructed to not assign mandatory work at the request of the parents who have said, "Please let us relax and decompress." However, I do hear the other side as well. I know that some of you have conference calls and virtual meetings, and you need resources to keep your child engaged. So, we've created an Optional Activities Website, which you can find <u>here</u> or on the front page of the OPS website. It is split up into several sections:

- **BASIC SKILLS:** For each grade level (PreK-6), there is a link to a week of Scholastic Activities. There is also a link to appropriate grade level skill games.
- 20 MINUTES A DAY: Keyboarding, geography, and math facts are all great activities to do daily in short bursts.
- VIRTUAL FIELD TRIPS: There have been a gazillion social media posts and emails going around about places to visit. We identified some of the best for you.
- BreakoutEDU: This website has academic games built around an "escape room" theme.
- **NON-SCREEN ACTIVITIES:** Need some ideas for keeping engaged away from the screen, we searched the web and created a list for you.

There are also several optional activities going on that are outlined on the front page of the Additional Learning Website including:

What matters most right now is that your child feels safe and loved.
