Dear OPS Community,

I'm not sure who first said, "You're damned if you do and damned if you don't"; however, I understand that sentiment completely this evening. Over the past ten hours, I've been told that sending students to the show could be the cause of a massive outbreak of coronavirus in our community. I've been told that our children could be the carriers that infect medically fragile adults. I've been told that while parents feel the trip is dangerous, they don't want their child to be the outcast. I've also been told that we are overreacting ... that we should be more concerned about the flu ... and that not going will cause anxiety to grow.

So why cancel? As principal, my first job is to take the information I have and use it to inform decisions that keep students safe. The conservative, safe decision is to minimize crowd settings and not to attend the performance. Additionally, with the River Dell District canceling all trips outside the state, it feels inconsistent as a larger community to not follow a similar protocol.

That being said, I believe parents are the ultimate decision makers for their child. While OPS will not be conducting an approved field trip to the Gershwin Theater tomorrow, I do have 175 non-refundable tickets.
